Emergency Shelter Operations	As part of the COVID-19 Economic Response Plan, the government of Canada will provide up to \$10 million to ISC's network of shelters on reserve and in Yukon to help them manage or prevent an outbreak in their facilities. The funding is being distributed through ISC's regional offices through existing contribution agreements and using FVPP authorities. Eligible recipients are the 46 shelters currently receiving operational funding through the FVPP. The amount for each shelter was determined using a formula that includes factors such as on-reserve population, remoteness and number of beds.
